All students in the Scott Police Academy will be required to wear their Academy uniform when requested (approximately one day per week). This uniform will be provided to students.

All students who are enrolled at Scott Collegiate or attend classes in our building are required to wear a blue shirt all day during the school day, including lunch hours and breaks, and while attending classes. The Dress Code promotes school spirit, school pride, and demonstrates the value we hold in the importance of education and attending school. The Dress Code applies to all students in grades 9 through 12. Students may wear Scott Collegiate gear or their own blue shirts.

If a student arrives to school not wearing a blue shirt, she or he may be given a shirt to wear that day if needed, and will be reminded of the dress code expectation. Students who continually come to school unprepared or unwilling to adhere to the Dress Code will be required to meet with administration and may be sent home to change or suspended, situation dependent. Scott Collegiate gear will also be available for purchase during the school year.

Many communities also use the term "First Nation" in the name of their community. "Registered Status Indian" refers to an individual recognized by the federal government as being registered under the Indian Act is referred to as a Registered Indian (commonly referred to as a Status Indian). "Non-Status Indian" refers to an Indian person who is not registered as an Indian under the *Indian Act*. "Métis" refers to people of mixed First Nation and European ancestry who identify themselves as Métis, as distinct from First Nations people, Inuit or non-Aboriginal people.
