#### **STUDENT ADVISORY PROGRAM**

All Regina Public high schools have a student advisory program in place. Teachers act as an advisor to a small group of students. While in wichitowin, students and their advisor will work together to develop a greater sense of belonging for the student, regularly monitor attendance and academic progress and develop an online portfolio for career and post-secondary planning.

### Scott Police Academy

The Scott Police Academy is a program collaboratively created by Regina Public Schools and the Regina Police Service. The program is designed for students from all parts of the school division who are interested in the field of law enforcement. Students will be part of an innovative teacher and police officer-led high school program that educates through hands-on, experiential and project-based learning. Curricular outcomes will be infused with police based learning and experiences. A grade 9 and 10 class will operate in the 2021/2022 school year with subsequent grades to evolve in the following years. Students in the Academy are offered courses that meet requirements for post-secondary opportunities, specifically for future careers in law enforcement.
